

## Attitude Grades

Teachers will be assessing the all-round approach and attitude of students in their subjects. This will include engagement in class, enthusiasm, quality of work, worth ethic etc – not just their attainment. The attitude scale is:

- 1 = outstanding (used reservedly and only for a truly exceptional week)
- 2 = excellent
- 3 = good
- 4 = inconsistent (some evidence of good attitude, but not consistent)
- 5 = limited (concerns regarding the approach in the subject)
- 6 = unacceptable (serious concerns)

These weekly grades should give you a clear picture of attitude across subjects.

## Interim Assessments

For the interim weeks (weeks 4,8,12) you will see a focused teacher comment (a short subject comment for the cycle) with an accompanying national curriculum level for either a recent assessment or as an indicator or performance/level in that cycle. Over the course of the term, and year, we will all be able to measure progress with a clear picture of the levels being reached in subjects.
