BRYANSTON SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. A breach of common sense or courtesy is a breach of school rules.
2. A breach of the law of the land is a serious breach of school rules.
3. Bringing the school and the school's name into disrepute is a serious breach of school rules.
4. The following are forbidden:
 - Drugs and drugs paraphernalia. Alcohol. Smoking (including Vaping). Tobacco (including snuff). Fireworks. Joss sticks. Matches. Lighters.
 - Blatant physical contact. Night wandering. Fake ID. Pornographic material.
 - Going out of bounds without permission. Hitch-hiking.
 - Being on the roof of any building and, in particular, the main building. Using the climbing tower without authorisation.
 - Weapons. BB guns and laser pens. Facial/body piercing/tattoos.
 - Pets. Personal TVs. Chewing gum.
5. Pupils may not drive a motor vehicle and they may not be driven in a motor vehicle by anyone under the age of 21.

The School Day

Leaving the House: Not before 7.00 am but by 7.45 am on weekdays (not before 8.00 am on Sundays).

Communication: All pupils must access their school email account at least twice each day; once in the morning and once in the evening. Furthermore, all pupils must read the 24 hour board (and adjacent boards) after breakfast, lunch and supper.

Accountability: All pupils are required to register in the morning (in House) and at lunch time (biometrically outside the Dining Hall). It is a pupil's responsibility to ensure that he/she has obtained appropriate permission from his/her Hsm to be out of the House/out of school. It is also a pupil's responsibility to comply with "Bounds" regulations. After "In school" time, pupils may only pass directly between school buildings.

Assignments: Must be in blue or black ink (if hand written). Silence must be observed in the subject rooms at all times except when talking to a teacher.

Rest Period: For all pupils from 1.55 pm - 2.15 pm in houses.

Games: A shower or bath should be taken after games. Dirty or studded footwear must not be worn inside any building. Ball games must not be played within fifty metres of a building.

Houserrooms/
Study Bedrooms: Cooking, eating, drinking and visiting are forbidden during school periods or preps. Pupils should be aware of the visiting regulations and may not visit others outside their own or adjacent year groups. Pupils in C and D may not work in their House during School periods. Pupils in B and A3 may only work in their study bedrooms in daytime with the permission of his/her Hsm and this privilege may be removed at any time.

Music:	May NOT be played: after 9.45 pm, during lesson time, during prep/worknight or Rest, before Sunday Church/Assembly or between 4.30 pm and 6.00 pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
Mobile phones I-pods/MP3s:	Must be switched off (or on silent mode) in assembly, lessons, prep, assignment periods and after lights out. Mobile phones should be left in House during exams and also when watching plays/music events.
Computers:	Must not be used to watch films/play games/listen to music in lessons or during assignment periods, prep or after lights out.
Dining Hall:	Games kit may not be worn in the dining hall.
Echarts:	Pupils should check their echarts regularly, and be familiar with the comments made on them. The echart provides a forum for conversations between pupil, parent, teacher and tutor, and as such it is a useful vehicle for the pupil to use in a reflective capacity.
Breakers, EMRs and Detentions:	Must be done at the earliest opportunity.
Clothing/ appearance:	School dress is to be worn from 8.30 am until <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • after Period 9 on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays • after Rest on Tuesdays and Thursdays • after lunch on Saturdays. <p>In addition, it is to be worn for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sunday assemblies and church services • visits to Blandford (Mondays to Fridays) • other specific occasions. <p>Please note that other documents (Bryanston Dress Code/Regulations and the Bryanston Clothes Lists) form part of the School Rules and relate to pupils' dress/appearance.</p>
