## BRYANSTON SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

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1. A breach of common sense or courtesy is a breach of School rules.
2. A breach of the law of the land is a serious breach of School rules.
3. Bringing the School and the School's name into disrepute is a serious breach of School rules.
4. Pupils are expected to:
  - aim to do everything to the best of their ability whether this is academic work, sport, drama or other co-curricular activities.
  - attend all lessons and commitments.
  - arrive punctually to lessons and other commitments.
  - respect the learning environment created by the teacher.
  - keep up to date with work and submit assignments on time.
5. The following are forbidden: Drugs and drugs paraphernalia. Night wandering Blatant physical contact. Pornographic material. Being on the roof of any building and, in particular, the main building. Weapons. BB guns and laser pens. Fireworks. Hitch-hiking. Alcohol. Smoking. Vaping and Vaping equipment. Tobacco. Joss sticks. Matches. Lighters. Fake ID. Gambling. Using the climbing tower without authorisation. Going out of bounds without permission. Facial/body piercing/tattoos. Pets. Chewing gum.
6. Pupils may not drive a motor vehicle and they may not be driven in a motor vehicle by anyone under the age of 21.

### The School Day

- Leaving the House: Not before 7.00 am on weekdays (not before 8.00 am on Sundays).
- Communication: All pupils must access their school email account at least twice each day; once in the morning and once in the evening. Furthermore, all pupils must read the 24 hour board (and adjacent boards) after breakfast, lunch and supper.
- Accountability: All pupils are required to register in the morning (in House) and at lunch time (biometrically outside the Dining Hall). There is also a Roll Call at 7.20pm. It is a pupil's responsibility to ensure that they have obtained appropriate permission from their Hsm to be out of the House/out of school. It is also a pupil's responsibility to comply with "Bounds" regulations. After "In School" time, pupils may only pass directly between school buildings.
- Assignments: Must be in blue or black ink (if handwritten). Silence must be observed in the subject rooms at all times except when talking to a teacher.
- Rest Period: For all pupils from 1.55 pm - 2.15 pm in Houses, unless Hsm's permission for absence has been gained.
- Games: A shower or bath should be taken after games. Dirty or studded footwear must not be worn inside any building. Ball games must not be played within fifty metres of a building.

D Workrooms/ Dorms/Study Bedrooms:	Cooking, eating, drinking and visiting are forbidden during school periods or preps. Pupils should be aware of the visiting regulations and may not visit others outside their own or adjacent year groups. Pupils in A3, B, C and D may not work in their House during school periods. Pupils in A2 may occasionally only work in their study bedrooms in daytime with the permission of their Hsm and this privilege may be removed at any time.
Music:	Must never be played loudly. May NOT be played during lesson time or during prep/worknight.
Mobile Phones, iPods, Portable Music Devices:	Bryanston operates a non-visibility policy for these devices in the classroom, assignment rooms, Coade Hall and the Dining Hall. Pupils in D and C are required to keep such devices in the electronic lockers provided in the boarding houses for the duration of the academic day. 8.50 – 4.20 Mon, Wed, Fri (8.50 – 6.25 on Winter Timetable) 8.50 – 1.05 Tues and Thurs 8.50 – 12.25 Sat Pupils should not walk around the campus looking at mobile phones or similar and are expected to follow a courtesy of ‘eyes up, acknowledge others.’ Phones should be locked away and switched off overnight for pupils in D and C. For B and A2/A3 students, phones should be switched off or placed on airplane mode. Mobile phones should be left in houses during exams and also when watching plays/music events.
Computers:	Must be used for academic purposes during the school working day (lesson, assignment and prep time) They must not be used to play games, watch films or listen to music during the school working day and must not be used after lights out.
Echarts:	Pupils should check their echarts regularly and be familiar with the comments made on them. The echart provides a forum for conversations between pupil, parent, teacher and tutor, and as such it is a useful vehicle for planning ahead as well as using in a reflective capacity.
Breakers, EMRs and Detentions:	Must be done at the earliest opportunity.
Dress Code:	School dress is to be worn from 8.30 am until <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• after Period 9 on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays</li> <li>• after Rest on Tuesdays and Thursdays</li> <li>• after lunch on Saturdays.</li> </ul> In addition, it is to be worn for <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sunday assemblies and church services</li> <li>• visits to Blandford (Mondays to Fridays)</li> <li>• other specific occasions.</li> </ul> <p>Please note that the Bryanston Dress Code forms part of the School Rules and relates to pupils’ dress/appearance.</p>
