

SIXTH FORM SCHOLARSHIP TERMS AND CONDITIONS



1. Pupils are received into the first year of the sixth form between the ages of 16 and 17 years and are usually admitted in the autumn term.
2. Scholarship application forms should be completed online and submitted by the deadline as specified on our website for 16+ entry, Year 12 (Sixth Form). Application forms received after the closing date may not be considered.
3. Scholarship candidates are required to attend the scholarship day(s) in person at Bryanston, unless otherwise stated by the School.
4. Assessment criteria for candidates will include performance in their sphere of excellence, results of academic tests set by the school, impression at interview and a supporting reference from their previous school.
5. An offer of a scholarship in the sixth form is made at the discretion of the Headmaster and his decision is final. Offers will be made the week of the 1 December.
6. The offer is accepted by completing the Acceptance Form. On acceptance of an offer of a place in the sixth form, a deposit of £2200 (reviewed annually) is payable. One half of the deposit will be deducted from the first term's fees, the remainder from the final term's fees. Should the candidate withdraw after accepting the offer, the deposit will not be refunded.
7. Pupils who are awarded scholarships will enter the school the following September. Scholarships tenable throughout a scholar's career at Bryanston, are subject to them continuing to show the enthusiasm, commitment and leadership qualities expected of all Bryanston scholars.
8. Awards range in value from Honorary up to a maximum of 10% remission of the fees, irrespective of the number of scholarships awarded. This remission may be enhanced by a bursary if parents were to demonstrate, through a means tested process, that they could not otherwise send their child to Bryanston. 9. Families of a child being awarded a scholarship who may not be in need of financial support are invited to consider their child becoming an Honorary Scholar with the same status and responsibilities of all other scholars. Their remission can then be passed to another pupil whose financial need is fully shown.
10. The admission of a pupil is conditional on acceptance of the school's standard Terms and Conditions, a copy of which is available on request.
